In 2007, Lomakatsi and US Fish & Wildlife replaced a perched culvert with a bridge. This project, located on the south side of Mt. Ashland, in the mid-Klamath watershed, was designed to improve passage for resident steelhead trout.

- Willow pruning/management around established plantings
- Discussion on maintenance and monitoring of riparian restoration sites
