# Lomakatsi Restoration Project

We are a non-profit organization that develops and implements forest and watershed restoration projects in Oregon and northern California.



Since 1995, we have helped restore ecological balance across thousands of acres of forests and miles of streams. Our work has set precedents on nationally recognized projects.

We provide expertise and capacity in program development, planning, management, fine-scale ecological treatment design, monitoring and restoration implementation.



## Programs:

### Restoration

#### Restoration Forestry:

Restoring complex forest ecosystems while reducing the threat of uncharacteristically severe wildfire.

#### Oak Habitat Restoration:

Protecting and promoting the development of habitat and plant communities for oak associated wildlife.

#### Prescribed Fire:

Reintroducing fire for restoration and long-term maintenance of ecosystems to promote diversity, health and resiliency.

#### Aquatic Habitat Restoration:

Restoring streams and riparian zones for fish and wildlife habitat.

**Ecological Monitoring:** Improving restoration treatments through effectiveness and implementation monitoring.

### Education

#### Restoration Ecology Education:

Providing students, teachers and community members with hands-on restoration ecology education.

#### Community Outreach and Education:

Engaging the community in educational opportunities through forums, presentations, and workshops.

**Youth Training and Employment:** Inspiring the next generation of natural resource professionals through hands-on workforce training and employment.

## Collaborative Partnerships

Restoring ecosystems requires a collaborative community-based approach. We facilitate partnerships and engagement among a diversity of stakeholders. Our partners include federal and state land management agencies, Native American Tribes, The Nature Conservancy, land trusts, environmental organizations, industry, private landowners, city and county governments, and watershed councils.

## Tribal Ecosystem Restoration Partnership Program

### *Restoring Ecosystems and Enhancing Tribal Economies*

For more than fifteen years Lomakatsi has worked in partnership with Native American Tribes and tribal communities throughout Oregon and Northern California to build sustainable ecosystem restoration programs. Lomakatsi's tribal staff works closely with tribal and agency partners to incorporate Traditional Ecological Knowledge into ecosystem restoration projects. Tribal partnership initiatives assist in building tribal capacity for the implementation of ecological restoration across thousands of acres of ancestral lands. Lomakatsi works with tribal and agency partners in establishing long-term ecosystem restoration agreements where projects are implemented across federal, private and reservation lands. Partnerships with industry are also established and restoration by-products are generated from ecological thinning, supporting forest-related enterprises by providing saw logs, biomass, and small diameter materials to local mills. Additionally, hundreds of tribal jobs have been created through adult and youth workforce training programs, providing long-term employment.

## Engaging the Community

Our diverse staff of restoration practitioners, ecologists, workforce trainers and educators work to increase community understanding and involvement in forest and watershed restoration.
